


As of September 2019, 278 communities in West Virginia participated in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Of these communities, thirteen local governments (or 4.7%) qualified for the Community Rating System program.

These thirteen communities represented 25% of the NFIP policies in force.

Of the top 50 West Virginia communities, in terms of total Flood Insurance policies held by residents, 11 participate in the CRS. The remaining 39 communities present an outreach opportunity for encouraging participation in the CRS.
