Agenda Items 1,2,3 CALL TO ORDER/MOMENT OF SILENCE/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

After calling the meeting to order and welcoming all in attendance, Chairwoman Agnes Queen led the group in a moment of silent meditation and prayer and the "Pledge of Allegiance".

Agenda Item 4 INTRODUCTIONS:

Chairwoman Agnes Queen requested that everyone in attendance introduce themselves. Executive Director Shane Whitehair introduced the Council's new staff member – Peggy Ball, Administrative Assistant.

Agenda Item 5 PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES:

Chairwoman Agnes Queen asked if there were any additions or corrections to the previous meeting minutes from the October 24, 2016 quarterly meeting. With no corrections or additions indicated, Mike Cvechko made a motion to accept the minutes as recorded, and Mike Herron seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 6 TREASURER'S REPORT:

Connie Tenney reviewed balance sheet, profit and loss statement and the budget summary. Connie noted the large expenditure was for the GIS computer hardware and software which was included in the budget. No questions were asked regarding the financial reports.

Cam Matheny noted the significate changes of government accounting procedure for all leased items. Cam conducted a conference call with Rob Adams, auditor with Gibbons and Kawash presenting results of the audit they performed for Region VII Planning and Development Council for year ending June 30, 2016. Rob Adams expressed unmodified opinion of financial statement, which is the highest level of assurance they can provide with no audit adjustments needed.

Agenda Item 7 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT:

Chairwoman Queen stated that she did not have anything to present at this time.

Agenda Item 8 DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Shane Whitehair congratulated Upshur County Commission (Elkins Road PSD) and Town of Davis on receiving a Small Cities Block Grant for water extension projects.

Regional Broadband Project is getting closer to being funded, but still working on getting environmental clearances.

Shane and Cam met with WV Development Office staff to discuss how our indirect cost rate is calculated and implemented. Currently the WVDO is holding over \$60,000 worth of administrative invoices due to the fact that the WVDO thinks our rate is abnormally high. So, Cam and I met with the WVDO to explain how our rate is calculated and charged to projects. Shane believes the WVDO will eventually process the invoices, but not without Region VII having to jump through numerous hoops. No other federal or state agency has ever scrutinized our indirects as much as the CDB Program has. Cam noted that we would jump through the hoops to get this issue resolved.

Region VII staff has been meeting with a few local governments to provide GIS services. Now that the PDC has received the necessary equipment, the agency is starting to see more opportunities become available. In fact, Region VII might need to hire additional staff to assist with the additional workload.

ARC update, Shane went to DDDA meeting in South Carolina. Federal ARC cochair will be changing which may lead to delay in grants being approved. Region VII Planning and Development Council planning grant has been approved and will be receiving the first six months. Braxton County Canoe Run Project should be approved before the co-chair leaves his position.

Region VII monies in CD's is getting very low interest rate. Agnes suggested that we put together a financial committee to review investing options.

Personal Policy needs to be updated. Shane is working on updating and will have an attorney review before presenting to council for approval.

Private Sector Membership has some vacancies that need to be filled, Shane will be in contact with the County Commissioners of those counties to get those positions filled.

Status Report – Report is included in the packet for Council to review. Cary reviewed the report with members.

Agenda Item 9 REPORT/DISCUSSION ON PROJECTS AND ISSUES FROM MEMBER GOVERNMENTS:

A representative from each county was asked to discuss the status of any project, concerns and/or issues from their respective county.

BARBOUR COUNTY: Commissioner Tim McDaniel stated that the Century-Volga PSD Sewer Project needs to keep going. City of Philippi water replacement tank project is very badly needed. Also, the reservoir project needs completed.

BRAXTON COUNTY: Commissioner Ron Facemire stated that Flatwoods Canoe Run PSD Project waiting on final funding

GILMER COUNTY: Commissioner Larry Chapman noted Route 5/Orlando Water Project was a great success. Town of Sand Fork Sewer Upgrade Project has been much needed for years.

LEWIS COUNTY: Commissioner Agnes Queen reported that the Roanoke School Water Project Extension was a great success. City of Weston expansion of water and sewer projects are much needed. Industrial area, broadband and housing projects are needed. Region VII helped with securing the grant for a very nice ADA accessible playground area.

RANDOLPH COUNTY: Commissioner Mike Taylor stated the Harman Water Project and Hardwood Manufacturing Expansion are great successes. Town of Mill Creek issues will hopefully be resolved soon. Broadband will be a great asset. Randolph County Commission is working on obtaining the old FAA Flight Service Center to move the Elkins 911 as well as Mapping and Addressing to that location. City of Elkins water project will have a big impact on other local PSD projects.

TUCKER COUNTY: Commissioner Lowell Moore mentioned the Town of Davis Water Expansion has been great success in 2016. Diversion Dike in Parsons is a FEMA project that has been on hold due to environmental issues of removing trees, which have recently been removed, hopefully the project will start in July. Broadband is also much needed in rural areas. City of Parsons Administrator Jason Myers reported the City has tentatively been awarded grant for Source Water Testing Equipment. Jason also thanked Region VII for a job well done for the City Splash Park success.

UPSHUR COUNTY: Commissioner Terry Cutright noted securing the grant for the Upshur County Innovation Center was a great success in 2016 thanks to Region VII and Upshur Development Authority. Goals for 2017 will be the Broadband Project and Upshur County Airport extending the runway.

Agenda Item 10 ARC APPLICATION – GIS ANALYSIS AND MAPPING PROJECT

Economic Analysis & GIS Mapping grant application will be presented to ARC after not being approved by Federal EDA. This is a combination of economic recovery plan, GIS analysis and mapping project. We will be inventorying all businesses and commercial sites in our seven-county region that will serve as a dual purpose. First this information can be used in a disaster situation to speed up funding opportunities, secondly will help development authorities to plan for future development in their counties. This will be a two-year project. Region VII Council previously approved the matching funds under the Federal EDA plan of 70/30 matching grant that was not awarded. ARC funding is a 60/40 matching grant which will require Region VII Planning and Development Council to match about \$60,000 for the project. The ARC application is due at end of the month. Motion was made by Mike Ross to approve this revised project and was seconded by A.G. Trusler, Jr., all present voted in favor.

Agenda Item 11 REGIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

Our Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan expires this August 2017, FEMA has approved planning funds of \$61,000 to update this plan, however due to the time frame in getting this completed Shane recommended hiring JH Consulting which would provide this service for \$25,000. Shane ask Council to approve entering this agreement with JH Consulting to update regional plan. Mike Taylor motioned to approve this agreement and A.G. Trusler, Jr. seconded, all present voted in favor.

Agenda Item 12 CONSIDER PROJECTS FOR REVIEW

Projected were expeditiously reviewed by staff and need formal approval from the board. Motion to accept made by Larry Chapman, seconded by Mike Ross. Voted passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 13 ADJOURNMENT

With no further business to discuss, A.G. Trusler, Jr. made a motion to adjourn, which was seconded by Mike Ross before passing unanimously.



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

Jeff Harvey of JH Consulting, LLC gave an overview of information required and the process for completing the Hazard Mitigation Plan. Jeff stated this is a requirement under the Stafford Act to be eligible for Federal Hazard Mitigation Funds for hazard mitigation, elevation, buyout or reconstruction projects. This plan will be for all 31 jurisdictions in this region. Jeff will use the Council as the full advisory committee along with a Steering Committee that will consist of Emergency Managers and Floodplain Coordinators that accepted the invitation to represent their communities. Motion was made to accept this steering committee by Dennis Fitzpatrick and seconded by Mike Taylor, motion carried.

Shane reported that Community Development Block Grant Program will be shifting its focus from water and sewer projects to housing projects, partly due to the massive flooding in southern West Virginia last summer. The Development Office is looking at the Regional Councils to hire housing specialists to help with the transition and implementation of the housing program. Other changes made to the CDBG program include providing a small allocation for broadband projects. There will be to different application deadlines this year—June 30th deadline will be for water, sewer and general community development projects and October 30th will be for broadband projects.

Shane mentioned that he is still working with the Development Office regarding their indirect cost policy.

In an effort to stay in compliance with our by-laws, Shane will be contacting the Braxton County Commission, Gilmer County Commission, Randolph County Commission and the Upshur County Commission to fill their private sector vacancy. The goal is to have these open seats filled by July 1, 2017.

Shane provided an update on the Regional Broadband Project. Shane reported that the environmental requirements will soon be approved. The hope is to hear a funding announcement by June 2017.

Shane asked Cary Smith to review the Project Status Report with the council.



Shane Whitehair welcomed the new mayor of Jane Lew and Beverly, who were in attendance. He also discussed the meeting held at Region VII Planning and Development Council office with the new council members to explain who we are and what we do. Shane offered any council member that has questions or concerns to come and meet with him and the staff.

Shane noted the Dionne Allen resigned her position with Region VII Planning and Development Council and he is in the process of filling that position. The goal is to have the position filled as soon as possible.

Shane updated the council about the proposed Federal Budget cuts that are forth coming and possible elimination of programs, including CDBG, ARC, EDA, USDA. Shane stated that he has been working with the congressional representatives that know the importance of these programs. These representatives are opposed to the proposed budget cuts. He stated that we receive federal planning grants from both ARC and EDA, if they are eliminated would be a hugh impact on Region VII Planning and Development Council. Shane prepared a Budget Resolution that will be discussed later in meeting.

Shane reported that the State Budget was finally passed, however we do not know what our state allocation will be. The WV Development Office supports the regional councils; however, they are reviewing their budget before they can allocate any funds. These funds are important as we use them to match our federal planning grants.

Shane announced the Regional Broadband Project was approved by USDA for a three-million-dollar grant. This project will cover Barbour, Randolph and Upshur counties.

Shane discussed the private sector vacancies in the following counties: Braxton, Gilmer, Upshur and Randolph. He stated that these must be filled to meet the EDA planning grant requirements.

Shane asked Cary to give update on Small Cities Block Grant applications. She noted that the following six applications were submitted June 30: Lewis County EDA Phase I Water Extension Project, Barbour County Chestnut Ridge Water Improvements, Braxton County Exchange Road Waterline Extension Phase II, Town of Sutton Storm Sewer Phase II, Burnsville Wastewater Project, and City of Parsons and Hamrick PSD Water Interconnectivity Project. Shane added this is the first year that CDBG includes Broadband Projects which has a deadline of October 30, 2017. He also stated that program is looking to expand into housing initiative due to the floods in southern WV last year.

Shane referenced the progress report included in packet as only the projects Region VII is currently managing.

Shane gave update on current GIS Projects the staff is working on—City of Buckhannon, Upshur County CVB Story Map, Upshur County Commission Address Mapping-Phone Numbers Project, City of Parsons Water System Mapping.

Agenda item 10 CONSIDER RESOLUTION CONCERNING FEDERAL PROGRAMS

Shane discussed the Budget Cuts Resolution stating disapproval of President Trump's recent budget proposal requesting deep cuts to federal funding in FY2018 and the elimination of agencies and programs critical to distressed communities including EDA, ARC, USDA, HUD and CDBG. Shane noted the resolution will be forwarded to our congressional representatives.

Mike Herron made motion to adopt the Budget Cuts Resolution and Dennis Fitzpatrick seconded, all present voted in favor, motion carried.

Agenda item 11 FY2018 OFFICERS

Shane stated that he and Agnes had contacted all the present officers to see if they would be interested in serving another year. Shane noted that this would be the last year Agnes Queen could serve as chairman. The by-laws state the ach officer position has a four-year term limit, except Treasurer. All current officers agreed to serve another year. Dennis Fitzpatrick made motion to approve all officers to continue serving another year, motion was seconded by Greg Cunningham. All present voted in favor, motion carried.

Agenda item 12 REPORT ON EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S EVALUATION – MARK DOAK

Mark Doak reported on the Director's evaluation which included evaluation itself, future direction and compensation. Mark Doak stated he along with Agnes Queen; Mike Cvechko, Barbour County; Mike Taylor, Randolph County; Lowell Moore, Tucker County completed the evaluation. Evaluation committee agreed that Shane Whitehair is doing an outstanding job in all classifications. The committee stated they were very comfortable with Shane's leadership and are very pleased to have him as the Director. Mark talked about the future of this organization will require searching for other revenue sources to make up shortfalls of current funding. Committee recommended Shane to provide value to council member attendees of the quarterly meetings by having more interaction within members. Shane and the committee would like to have a member from all organizations to be present at the council meetings. They discussed the office locations current lease expires in 2019, would like to look at other options prior to renewal of lease. Committee noted that Shane attends ARC national conference as well as other conferences and they would like him and other office staff to continue to attend these. Mark stated that Shane serves on the DDAA board and would like him to continue that involvement. Committee approved an increase of compensation for Shane that is within the range the staff received.

Shane ask for council to look over the projects for review. Cindy Whetsell made a motion to approve the projects for review and was seconded by Dennis Fitzpatrick, all in attendance voted in favor, motion was carried.

Agenda item 14 ADJOURNMENT – NEXT MEETING DATE



PROPOSED FY2018 BUDGET CUTS RESOLUTION

A resolution of the Region VII Planning and Development Council stating disapproval of President Trump's recent budget proposal requesting deep cuts to federal funding in fiscal year (FY) 2018 and the elimination of agencies and programs critical to distressed communities including the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA), Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC), U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Business-Cooperative Service, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, among others resulting in a significant reduction of proven support for local and regional economic and community development as well as housing, workforce, and infrastructure.

WHEREAS the Region VII Planning and Development Council is a public organization representing Barbour, Braxton, Gilmer, Lewis, Randolph, Tucker and Upshur Counties and the 24 municipalities therein in north-central West Virginia;

WHEREAS the Region VII Planning and Development Council is a designated Economic Development District through the U.S. Economic Development Administration and a designated Local Development District through the Appalachian Regional Commission;

WHEREAS the Region VII Planning and Development Council, since 2000, has administered 17 U.S. Economic Development Administration grants; 25 Appalachian Regional Commission grants; 31 HUD Community Development Block Grants program;

WHEREAS the Administration proposes to significantly reduce and eliminate federal funding for fiscal year 2018;

WHEREAS the Region VII Planning and Development Council administers programs impacting job creation and retention, business development, housing, environmental quality, infrastructure, and local government needs and services;

WHEREAS federal funding set to be cut and withdrawn, through Region VII Planning and Development Council, has helped to create and retain over 1,000 jobs; leveraged over \$85 million of public and private investment; provided over 10,000 households with public water, sewer and broadband services; and maintained other substantial benefits;

WHEREAS the Region VII Planning and Development Council endorses efforts to improve efficiencies and eliminate waste, abuse, and fraud, but opposes any cut or elimination of programs and services administered by the Region VII Planning and Development Council and contributing to economic and community development in 31 local governments in north-central West Virginia.



Welcome and Introductions



What is a Hazard Mitigation Plan?

- Formal document that identifies risk to all hazards (e.g., Flooding, High Winds, Winter Storms, Land Subsidence, Wildfires, Earthquakes, etc.). It will also incorporate mitigation strategies and risk reduction strategies. It is a LIVING document!
- Plan must be reviewed/updated/re-adopted and submitted to FEMA every 5 years. The plan expires 8/13/17.



History

- 2012: First Regional Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan completed by the Region 7 Planning and Development Council
- Prior plans were completed at the county level.



Our Process – Committee

- Committee Review Will need to meet regularly to work through the document in order to complete the timeline.
- Additional contact with committee members will be made through email, and teleconference as needed.
- Committee members will be asked to complete tasks specific to their jurisdiction.
- JHC planning staff will be primarily responsible for research and document drafting.



Our Process - Public Input

- Public input is required per FEMA, and can be obtained in multiple ways.
 - Hazard Mitigation meetings in each jurisdiction for the public to comment on the process.
 - Copies of the plan placed at county offices/libraries for public review and comment.
 - Online surveys regarding the current plan, public thoughts on hazard mitigation, and comments on the updated plan draft.
 - Social media presence is very important for these surveys to be successful.



Estimated Project Schedule

- 4/24/17 Kick-off Meeting
- June July On-going meetings and communication with steering committee. Surveys disseminated and public meetings scheduled. Draft materials sent to committee members for review.
- July Full draft presented for approval to the committee and full council.
- August Submittal to WVDHSEM for approval
- After State approval, Plan is sent to FEMA Region III for approval. The plan expires 8/13/17.

 - 1 incident since 1996, no reported damage.

Hazard Review: Drought

- Noted NOAA NCEI Events
 - Drought = 55 since 1997
 - An event is noted for each county (I.E. one drought period will show up for each county affected in the data), however droughts will generally effect multiple counties or the entire region.



Hazard Review: Earthquake

- West Virginia Geological and Economic Survey
 - Six events since 2012
 - January 10th, 2012: 2.8 magnitude event in Braxton County
 - March 31st, 2013: 3.4 magnitude event in Braxton County
 - July 20th, 2013: 2.7 magnitude event in Gilmer County

I was forwarded the message below in which you asked the University to identify any measures we take to mitigate damage from several natural hazards. We do not have any special measures with regard to the following: drought, earthquakes, extreme temperatures, flooding (being at the top of the hill, not much of an issue for us), land subsidence.

We do have generators powered by natural gas for some of our critical systems to mitigate against power outages for severe and winter storms. Those systems that are backed up by generators include central IT services, emergency response center, and some research facilities to require consistent refrigeration. When we know storms are approaching that could result in a lengthy power outage, we order a couple of generators to operate our dining facility.

As far as our student population, here is a profile for a typical year:

Total # of students: 1100

Total # of students living on campus: 900

We require our undergraduate students (approximately 1000 of our 1100 total enrollment) to live on campus unless their home is within a 50 mile radius of the campus.


