# The Paint Creek Flood of 1932

#### **Event Details**

• Date: July 1932

Flood Type: Summer ThunderstormPrecipitation Amount: Unknown

• Fatalities: 18

• Impacted Streams: Paint Creek, Armstrong Creek (1 fatality)

• Location: Primarily Kanawha County (with 2 fatalities in Fayette County)

#### **Mitigation Efforts**

• No mitigation efforts were implemented following the flood event.

## **Risk and Impact Analysis**

- Flood Zone Classification:
  - 100% of fatalities occurred in FEMA Zone A
- Cause of Death:
  - 18 by drowning
- Fatality Locations (limited data):
  - 12 in water
  - 6 in structures

### **Demographics of Victims**

- Age Groups:
  - 3 children (Ages 0–12)
  - 1 young adult (Ages 19–39)
  - 6 middle-aged adults (Ages 40–70)
  - 1 elderly adult (70+)
- Gender Distribution (of known victims):
  - 7 female
  - 4 male
- Race (of known victims):
  - 38.9% Black

## Mass Casualty Events (66.7% of fatalities):

- Kincaid Family: A father and his three children were swept away by rising floodwaters.
- Mitchell Family: The father awoke to thunder and rushed to wake his family. As he stepped outside, he heard a massive crash—waters carrying a tree trunk surged through. His wife and children were swept away, never to be seen again.
