Event Details

Date: June 1950Time: 6:30 PM

• Precipitation: Over 13.8 inches in 5 hours

• Facts: 123 homes destroyed, 1,292 homes damaged (USGS)

• Flood Type: Summer Thunderstorm

• Fatalities: 31

• Main Impacted Streams: South Fork Hughes River (6 fatalities), Middle Island Creek (19 fatalities)

• Location: Ritchie and Doddridge Counties, WV

• Communities Impacted Most: Smithburg, Berea

Mitigation Efforts

- Stream gauge installed on Middle Island Creek (covering 61.29% of fatalities)
- No mitigation measures in place for 35.48% of fatalities
- Structural protection (3.2% of fatalities) from a dam on the North Fork Hughes River

Risk and Impact Analysis

- Flood Zone Classification:
 - 38.7% Zone A
 - 61.3% Zone AE
- Cause of Death:
 - 27 by drowning
 - 1 related to pre-existing medical conditions
 - 2 due to utility-related causes
- Fatality Locations:
 - 25 in structures
 - 3 in vehicles
 - 2 in water

Demographics of Victims

- Age Groups:
 - 11 children (Ages 0–12)
 - 1 teenager (Ages 12–18)
 - 4 young adults (Ages 19–39)
 - 13 middle-aged adults (Ages 40-70)
 - 2 elderly (Ages 70+)
- Gender Distribution:

- 19 female
- 12 male
- Mass Casualty Events (74.2% of fatalities):
 - Bailey Home: A birthday party at the Bailey residence near Middle Island Creek was overtaken by floodwaters, sweeping away 13 people
 - Cooper Family: Warned to evacuate, the Coopers chose to stay and move furniture to higher ground. All six family members were swept away with their home
 - Koontz Household: In Berea, Mrs. Koontz had two guests over during the storm. Her grandchildren tried to assist a neighbor, but all perished in the flood
