Once the site of a rural, swampy, self-sufficient district of the city, Eastwick was targeted for Urban Renewal in 1950 and was redeveloped into the suburban rowhome character it has today. Currently, coordination between the Eastwick community, the city of Philadelphia, the Army Corps of Engineers, FEMA and non-profit partners is ongoing and is receiving support through the BRIC-DTA program. Hear about the history, coordination, and potential solutions to addressing the flooding.
