What is a Planning Workshop? A Planning Workshop, also known as a charrette, is a structured, collaborative session in which a group comes together to develop a solution to a problem.

Who develops it and when is it developed? Ultimately, the Huntington District is the "owner" and convener of the planning workshop, and the study team is responsible for ensuring the outcomes of the planning workshop meet the needs of the study. A planning workshop is an opportunity to have the full PDT and all levels of the vertical team – District management, PCXs, Division and Headquarters, and nonfederal sponsor – work together in a focused and intensive workshop to advance the study, share information, and make decisions.

Purpose: The purpose of the Kanawha River Basin Feasibility Study Planning Workshop is to have an interdisciplinary group work together to share initial information relative to the study, understand different perspectives, and work through an iteration of the 6-step planning process.

The specific goals for this Workshop are to:

- 1. Achieve consensus on the problems, opportunities, objectives, and constraints (POOCs) for the study.
- 2. Develop a common understanding of the future without project condition (FWOP).
- 3. Develop and agree upon the decision criteria that will be important in evaluating alternatives.
- 4. Achieve consensus on an initial list of measures to be considered for the study.
- 5. Develop a list of specific data, tools, analyses, assumptions, risks, and other relevant information that will be needed for the study.
